



who jeer at *me and mock*.

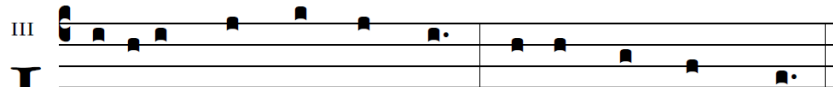
O let there be rejoicing *and gladness*

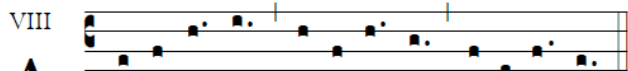
You turn man back to dust,

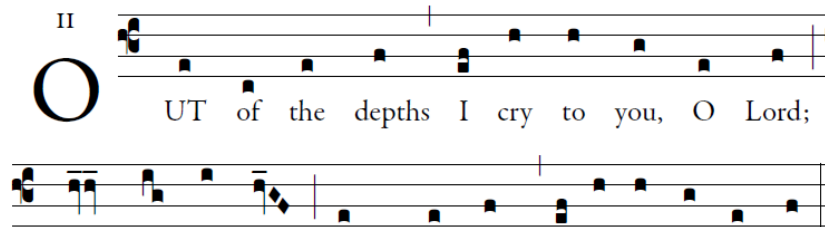

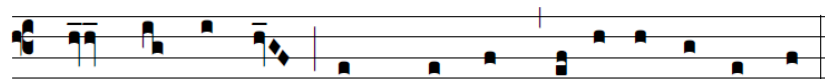
