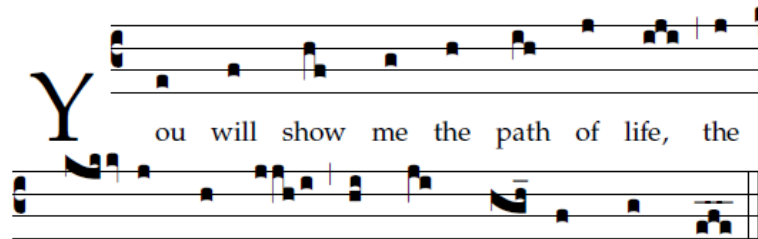

Such a one shall never be shaken**

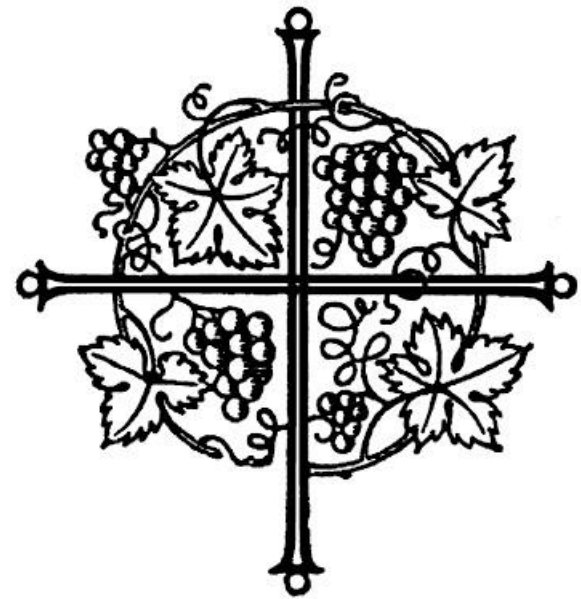
