

Gentiles, these have taught us your law, O Lord.


Psalm 19 (18): 2-3, 4-5, 6, 7

1. O shepherd of *Israel*, hear us, *

2. You brought a vine *out of* Egypt; *
you drove out the nations *and* planted it.
